



Mission of the Month Spotlight

The Bunk Bed Project® is an effort by EI Amor de Patricia, an organization with the mission of *empowering Guatemalan children, families, and communities to reach their full potential.* The project provides beds for families in need. Volunteers bring the beds, which are made in Guatemala, to the homes of identified families in need and remove what they were using as beds, such as twigs, cinder blocks, wood pallets or nothing and replace them with new bunk beds. One bunk bed costs \$220, which includes bed/mattresses, two comforters, two pillows, and delivery with a translator and/or guide. The project uses small metal beds that will not get moldy in the rainy season and are small enough to fit in small houses. They also use thin mattresses that can be hung to dry if necessary.

On November 2, Hurricane Eta, a powerful Category 4 storm, hit Nicaragua, Honduras and Guatemala. Throughout Central America, at least 171 people died. Winds as high as 150 mph caused power outages and structural damage while heavy rains caused catastrophic flooding and landslides, damaging homes, crops, roads and bridges. Just two weeks later, Hurricane lota made landfall in Nicaragua, 15 miles from where Hurricane Eta had made landfall. Iota was the first Category 5 hurricane of the 2020 season, but it weakened to a Category 4 hurricane as it made landfall. It brought strong winds and rains to areas already devastated by Hurricane Eta, hampering any ongoing recovery. **Your gifts designated for "Hurricane Response" will be used** entirely (100%) for direct response until it is complete. Together, we can help provide immediate and long-lasting support for those whose lives have been impacted by hurricanes.

St. Mark's Food Pantry is doing well, with a few new people stopping by for help as well as the regular patrons.

Some very generous people have donated 240 handmade hats and 12 afghans to help our friends and neighbors keep warm during these cold winter months. In different times, they would have all been displayed in church to brighten the holidays. Thanks to all who crafted these beautiful gifts.

In October, 154 people benefitted from the food they received from us. We always need paper products, dish and laundry detergent, juice, spam and tuna and just regular everyday things to help feed our families. Cash always helps, too. - 3. Laurie Olson and Mary Jane Hartley have gathered the information needed to complete the PPE Justification paperwork. They are now waiting for the local bank to contact them with the information for logging on to the computer program so they can enter the information.
- 4. The checks for the gifts to the missions of the month from Keith Niemuth trust fund were sent out for a total of \$3,290.30. One of the missions that we were going to give \$200 {Haiti} is no longer an option. One suggestion was to give to Ally Jansen's Go Fund Me Page. Ally is a 14 year old who is fighting cancer for the second time. Last time she was 4 years old. - 5. Stewardship Sunday will be November 8th. We reviewed the documents to be sent out for our Annual Stewardship Campaign. We watched two videos from the culture of generosity program.

Social Ministry:

- 1. Thank You note was received for donation to Haiti Food Pantry.
- 2. Discussed Food Pantry account and how many people are helped each month.
- 3. Karen discussed our budget account- will get more gift cards for the up-coming holidays.
- 4. Hats are given to people coming to the food pantry. Have 240 hats. Some will go to Brigade Christmas giving and the Christine Anne Center.
- 5. Budget to remain at \$750 for next year.

NEWS FROM CROSSWAYS CAMP



Even in the midst of continued uncertainty, we are making plans to open registration for Summer Camp 2021. It will look different than it has in the past. All of these plans are tentative and may change based on state/federal mandates, input from our health officials, and best practices emerging from the American Camp Association. We will communicate any updates as they happen.

Timeline

We are planning to open registration on <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 4</u>. This is quite a bit later than usual, which we hope gives us the time to get better information to you. We would rather delay registration than have to make mass changes or cancellations like last year.

Youth Camp

We are planning to open youth camp with a 50% capacity. If Covid conditions across the state warrant it, we may be able to raise that threshold. We are encouraged by the emerging reports from schools and summer camps that have been successful in mitigating the risk of the virus.

Family Camp

We will continue the practice of assigning housing by family. We may need to limit capacity based on the staffing we are able to provide.

Confirmation Camp

Confirmation Camp will open with a 50% capacity. We are meeting with individual Confirmation Leaders from across the Synod to help us think through the ways we can keep our campers safe.

Day Camp

In order to focus on health and safety during Covid, with new ways of doing programming at camp, we will NOT be scheduling Day Camp experiences for summer 2021.
