*"Be patient, therefore, beloved, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near." (James 5:7-8 NRSV)*

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the verses above from the book of James, the writer encourages the church to be patient in waiting for **the Lord's return**. It is likely that the church is suffering persecution and James does not want them to give up hope.

Because of the coronavirus, this past year has been a particularly difficult, not only for our church community, but for people around the world. In no way do I want to equate the persecution of the early church to our situation, but still, when times are rough and we are waiting on the situation to improve, being patient is not easy.

Last year, St. Mark's Church Council felt it was in the best interest of the health of our faith community to not celebrate the Lord's resurrection with in-person worship. Now, this year, many of us will gather in-person on Easter Sunday, but still it will not be as it was in the past. Everyone will be wearing a mask, there will be physical distancing, and no Easter breakfast or fellowship after the worship service.

We continue to "wait on the Lord" to make things as they were before. And, for those who still feel vulnerable about meeting in-person for health reasons, I would encourage you to continue to gather in community and worship on our St. Mark's Facebook page.

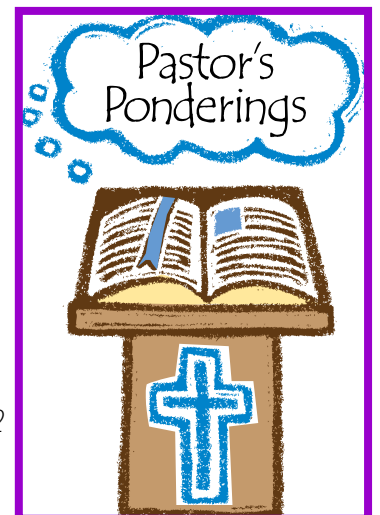
Like the farmer in James' analogy, we must be patient for both the early and the late rains will come.

Having grown up on a farm, the one thing I do know, is that a farmer does not sit around and wait for the crops to grow. There are always other chores to keep you busy. Perhaps, there are livestock to feed, buildings and fences to repair, or other crops to fertilize, cultivate, and, if possible, to water.

Waiting on the Lord does not mean that we stop doing what we can.

The story is told of a of a long-time church member who would interject the same advice into every problem. At some point in the discussion, he would stand up and say, "Let's pray about it and turn it over to God to take care of." Praying for God's guidance is always wise no matter the circumstance, however, we ought to remember that God is at work, not only through our prayers, but through our actions.

### Pastor's Report

3. In preparation for our mid-week Lenten Worship services, I recorded several dialogues from our "Overheard" Lenten Worship series with various members of St. Mark's Church.
4. I continue to offer weekly confirmation classes on Wednesday evening for St. Mark's 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students on line.
5. I continue to work with my wife, Laurie, in assembling worship videos to upload to St. Mark's Facebook page and to record onto DVD's.
6. I continue to meet with our church musicians and a few others to record worship music for our worship services.
7. I continue to meet with St. Mark's Committees as needed.
8. I met with St. Mark's Reopening Task Force to discuss best practices for returning to in-person worship service.

#### Christian Education:

1. Lessons for coming months:
  - March—Easter Cards to color —Easter Story—Make an Easter Cross
  - April—Easter is April 4.
2. Lenten Material -A mobile to put together that Pastor will order from Creative Communications.
3. Returning to Sunday School—We will not be returning until there is no social distancing and no mask mandate. The kids have enough while in school. Would rather have them come to church with the parents. Sunday School might not start up again until Fall. We will just wait and see what happens.

#### Finance/Stewardship:

1. Mary Jane reviewed the current giving for January, which was \$14,788.69 and expenditures were \$14,356.72. Our spending was under by \$431.97.
2. We have a negative amount in the Technology account. The Memorial Committee met and have arranged for dollars from some of the memorial funds be used to cover the expense of the new sanctuary camera system. Additional funds, needed to cover the balance of the technology expenses, will be moved out of the Thrivent Mutual Fund.
3. An additional \$200 remains in the Keith Niemuth Estate Fund, which was part of the dollars initially moved out of the Thrivent account for the extra mission support. Pastor Bob has recently **become aware of a member of a St. Mark's family in need of** assistance. He will suggest to the council to send the \$200 amount to this family. {More under New Business}.
4. The Property Committee brought a request to the council to consider transferring the funds that would be used to pay a custodian into the Building Fund. Our current custodians have requested this be done. The Council had previously presented an accounting option to the custodian volunteers, but due to tax preparation issues, this will not work for them. The Finance Committee discussed various options and has recommended that the Council approve moving \$200 per month {during the months volunteers are doing the custodial duties} from the regular giving into the Building Fund. This would be done as a journal entry. It was noted that some type of paper voucher/invoice needs to be filed, to

have a paper trail. {This now needs to be revisited as our current custodial volunteers are not able to continue at this time}.

5. Laurie is going to gather the information from the Stewardship Campaign and the committee will look at the results.

#### Memorial Committee

1. Went over the existing memorial accounts and transferred several of the balances over to cover the **cost of the new sanctuary camera. Thank You's have been sent out to the families.**

#### Worship and Music:

1. January services were discussed. A parking Lot Service with Communion was held on January 10<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Karen Ressel will preach on January 31<sup>st</sup>. Pastor Bob will be on vacation that week.
2. Another Parking Lot Service with communion will take place on February 14<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting. Ash Wednesday is on February 17<sup>th</sup>. Depending on the Covid-19 situation, we are planning an in-person worship service on Ash Wednesday.

Youth: No Meeting

Committee Reports: MSC by Phyllis Ziemke/Nancy Rose.

#### Unfinished Business:

Contracted Services – Organists from now on moving forward will continue to get paid for their recorded music until such time they will be back playing in person at the church services. MSC by Pennie Linna/Nancy Rose.

Custodial Update – No one has applied for the position at this time. Joe, Sandy and Richie continue to clean the building as needed. Will check with outside cleaning services to get a cost idea.

#### New Business:

1. In light of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the following decisions have been put in place for St. Mark's church. This will be revisited on an as needed basis.
  - \* **All outside groups that meet at St. Mark's remain cancelled till further notice.** {Will re-examine this when we see how the in-service re-opening goes.}
  - \* **Regular Church services for St. Mark's has re-opened** and is on available on Facebook Live. Now that the camera is up and able to mainstream into the Fellowship Hall we do not need to limit our church worship service attendance.
  - \* Church office is presently open in the mornings. {Tuesday, Thursday and Friday}
  - \* Food Pantry program to continue, following safety guidelines.

All of the above decisions will continue to be monitored on a regular basis as we continue to work our **way thru this health crisis facing our country** 2. **St. Mark's Family in need** – discussed this from {Finance/Stewardship Committee Report #3} MSC by Phyllis Ziemke/Judy Hellman to approve this request.

3. **We received information on a program called "Living Into a Culture of Mission and Action."** It would give our church an opportunity to examine what is our mission and vision for the future. An ELCA

Pastor would be heading this up. It would consist of 4-7 congregations meeting monthly from March through July. There would be members from St. Mark's meeting on our own to establish what our needs and wants are. The Council did have some questions of which Laurie will check into. The cost for this program is \$1,800 and would be requested from Endowment. MSC by Pennie Linna/Judy Hellman to proceed forward with this program after Laurie gets some answers.

4. Budget review has been set for February 21<sup>st</sup> in the church following worship.

5. The Annual Meeting set for February 28<sup>th</sup> in the church following worship.

6. The following assignments/placements are in place for both meetings.

\*Laurie Olson will be at one of the podiums running the meeting, Pastor Bob at the other podium.

\* Jason/Bruce will set up a table and chairs for Donna Joachim and Mary Jane Hartley in front.

\* Phyllis Ziemke/Mary Jane Hartley will hand out Budget review sheets on the 21<sup>st</sup>.

\* Judy Hellman will man the microphone in the church for any questions/comments.

\* Pennie Linna will man a microphone in the Fellowship Hall for questions/comments.

\* Bruce Grundman will man a microphone out in the parking lot for any questions/comments.

On the 28<sup>th</sup> the same as above except:

\* Phyllis Ziemke/Mary Jane Hartley will hand out Mission of the Month Ballots/ Pencils as well.

\* Council has two {3} year positions to fill. Pennie Linna and Sharyn Gawlick are rerunning. It will be open to the floor for other names. Ballots will be handed out if needed.

\* Our Youth Representative is for a one-year term. Mykayla Tharp has put her name on the ballot. This will be open to the floor for other names. Ballots will be handed out if needed.

\* Pastor, Phyllis Ziemke and Mary Jane to count ballots as needed and Mission of the Month Ballots.

## Tying together the Testaments

In most non-English-speaking nations, the holy day of Easter is known by a word derived from the Hebrew word for Passover: *Pesach*. **In Greek, it's *Pasch***; in Latin, *Pascha*; in Spanish, *Pascua*; and in French, *Paques*.

Each spring, Jewish people observe the Passover festival to commemorate how **God delivered them from slavery in Egypt. The Christian observance of the Lord's Supper (the Eucharist, Holy Communion or the Lord's Table) originated with Jesus sharing the Passover Seder meal with his disciples the night Judas betrayed him. Jesus connected the exodus story with his own mission: becoming a "Paschal Lamb" to save his people from the slavery of sin and its consequences.**

St. Mark's has entered into a mission and visioning process, financially supported by St. Mark's Endowment Fund. The purpose of *Living Into a Culture of Mission and Action* is to guide us through developing a mission and vision that is current, relevant for future ministry in an evolving culture and in partnership with God's work in the world.

Outcomes will include understanding the value and theological foundation of mission and vision planning, listening to scripture, the congregation and the community for how God is shaping us for future ministry, developing (or affirming) our congregation's identity and mission, creating a 12-36 month mission and vision plan with a detailed action plan, training for incorporating the plan successfully, and preparation and presentation of the mission and action plan to the congregation.

A congregational survey will be one of the first steps in this process. This is a prime vehicle for receiving input from a wide range of people in our community of faith, providing the mission and action team with feedback that will be critical in clarifying our identity and action. The more people that take the survey, the better the results will be. Please watch for the survey in the coming weeks. This entire process is prepared and grounded in prayer and scripture. We have been provided with weekly devotional materials that will be shared with you, introducing a biblical story of a time when someone (or a group) listened to God in some way. We thank you for prayerfully listening to God's call for our congregation.

April 14– Decluttering: What do I do with all my stuff? – How to get started with the process, what to keep and what to shred, and how to distribute non-titled property.

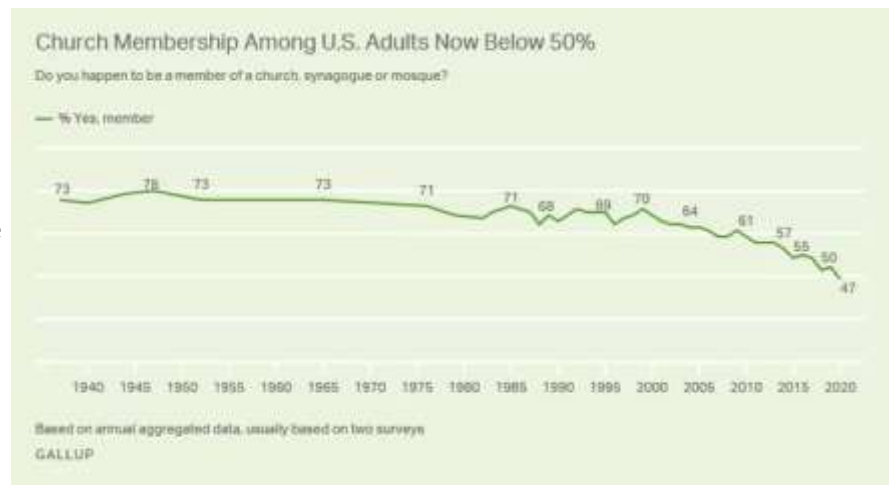
April 21 – Developing Connection and Belonging through Family History – Learn tips and tricks to uncover meaningful family stories that help connect you and your family to their roots.

As you can see, church membership has been in a decline since 2000, but it has now dipped to only 47% of our U.S. population. They were happy that the majority of people in our country have rejected organized religion, and no longer considered church membership important.
