

"For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single *commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself."* (Galatians 5:13-14 NRSV)

Dear partners in ministry,

As a child growing up on a dairy farm, other than the morning and evening chores, we typically took off each Fourth of July to celebrate. Looking back, when I think about Independence Day, images of small-town parades, cookouts, and fireworks, come to mind. At the time, I didn't give much thought to the freedoms we all enjoy as set forth in our Constitution, the Bill of Rights, and the subsequent Amendments.

These past few years, I have become increasingly aware of people, or groups of people, who aggressively claim their rights and freedoms as United States citizens. Whether it is the right to bear arms, the right to free speech, the right to marry whom you choose, the right to protest, everyone has a right they are willing to fight for.

Freedom of speech, freedom of religion and expression, freedom from discrimination, and many others, are fundamental rights that need to be protected. And yet our rights and freedoms have limits. The Supreme Court of the United States continues to debate and set limits to establish where one person's right starts to infringe on another person's freedom.

When chaplain Peter Marshall, prayed before the U.S. Senate on April 25, 1947, saying, "May we think of freedom, not as the right to do as we please, but as the opportunity to do what is right." I believe he was looking at our freedoms through a Christian lens.


In the verses above from Galatians, the Apostle Paul is clearly stating that Christian freedom is not to be abused. Even though, through faith in Christ, we are set free from sin, and human rules and doctrine, we are to use that freedom to love and serve our neighbor.

Martin Luther explores the concept of Christian freedom in his 1520 theses, *On the Freedom of the Christian*, and pens these two seemingly contradictory statements:

A Christian is an utterly free man, lord of all, subject to none.

A Christian is an utterly dutiful man, servant to all, subject to all.

Imagine how much better citizens we would be if we all viewed our rights and freedoms as U.S. citizens through the Christian maxim of "...love your neighbor as yourself."

Notes from the In-Person Task Force Meeting

The In-Person Task Force met and reviewed the current recommendations from the CDC, regarding masks, along with other Neenah church procedures. After discussion, it was decided to make the wearing of masks optional. It was further decided to allow outside groups to have coffee and food. Outside groups should continue to clean table tops after use. Church door signs have been updated to reflect the change. Laurie Olson will work with Jean in the church office to ensure outside groups are informed of the changes. We will continue to abide by the following procedures: Do not attend in-person worship or enter the church building if are sick or have recently been sick. Maintain social distancing between family groups (6-feet). There will be a maximum of people per pew or a family. At this time, we will not shake hands or hug during the sharing of peace. Pre-packaged Communion elements will be used on Communion Sundays.

With the success of the graduation reception, it was decided to resume weekly after-worship fellowship on June 13 with the following procedures in place:

HOSTING FELLOWSHIP DURING COVID-19

Place fellowship snacks/treats on individual serving plates/bowls.

Put a plastic eating utensil with each plate/bowl.

Place on stainless steel tables for individual pick-up.

Just before worship is concluding, pre-pour regular coffee & decaf and water & juice. These go on the brown tables against the wall. The host should pour additional cups of beverages, as needed. Tablecloths will not be used at this time.

The Task Force agreed to meet in a few weeks to review COVID-19 status/data and make further procedure changes, as needed.
