Dear Friends in Christ,

So, how do you plan to celebrate Juneteenth this year?

I will not fault you if you have no idea what I am talking about. Up until a few years ago I had never heard of Juneteenth, even though it has been a legal holiday in Wisconsin since 2009.

Many of you may remember from history class, that in 1863 President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, which essentially freed the slaves on land under Union control. However, the Civil War did not end until April of 1865, and it was not until June 19, 1865 when Major General Gordon Granger and the Union Army arrived in Galveston, Texas that the last 250,000 slaves in the United States were set free.


The name Juneteenth which is a combination of "June" and "nineteenth," is sometimes known as African American Freedom Day. Juneteenth is not yet a national holiday, but it is recognized as a holiday in 47 states in the Union. It can be startling to realize that although we celebrate Independence Day each fourth of July, that it took nearly another 100 years for many of our country men and women to truly have independence and freedom!

In the biblical book of Micah, from which the verse above is taken, the prophet has taken the nation of Israel to task for turning away from God. The community then asks, just what type of sacrifice will it take to satisfy the LORD? "Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my first born for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" (Micah 6:7 NRSV)

This of course is an exaggeration of cultic sacrifice to the extreme. To these questions, the Prophet Micah essentially says, No! God has told you what is good and what the LORD requires. It is to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with God.

This rebuke from the prophet still holds true for us today. Our worship services, our hymns of praise, our prayers of thanksgiving and lament all fall flat, if we are turning a blind eye to the injustices that happens in the world around us. When we take an honest look at our past, and look clear eyed at the present, it helps us to understand the concerns and viewpoints of our friends and neighbors of color.


#### Pastor's Ponderings

- 5. I recorded and posted Sunday morning children's messages to our St. Mark's Facebook page.
- 6. I continue to meet with our worship musicians and a few church members to record music for our worship services.

#### Finance/Stewardship:

- 1. Reviewed the end of the month current account balance. March giving was \$20,752,37 and expenses were \$17,082.21. Difference was +\$3, 670.16. year to date giving towards monthly expenses is +\$3,098.08.
- 2. Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$134,249.86, which includes \$58,466.91 allocated to designated accounts. Additionally, \$106,531.38 in the Thrivent money market and \$102,331.54 in the Mission Investment Fund.
- 3. Reviewed detailed financial reports. It was noted that St. Mark's received \$2,952.00 from the Thrivent Choice Dollars program and \$45.64 from the Script program. These dollars are included in the March giving number.
- 4. Mary Jane referred to a report on the activity related to designated account. Pastor Bob and Laurie thought this was a helpful report. Reviewed the report. It was noted that Technology funds still need to be moved from Thrivent Mutual Funds down into checking account designated account. Mary Jane and Laurie will take care of this before the next meeting.
- 5. Pastor Bob asked about a plan for the giving envelope boxes not yet picked up. Discussed options, which included the possibility of mailing the boxes and calling the individuals. Also, talked about the Connections Committee making the calls. It was decided
  - about the Connections Committee making the calls. It was decided to take time, within the next few weeks, and review which boxes are still not picked up and come up with a plan of action.
- 6. It was noted that once Fern enters 2021 pledges in the Church Windows programs, the first quarter statements will be mailed. Goal is to do this the week of April 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### Worship and Music:

- 1. The Lenten series was well received. The narrative helped make it more meaningful to everyone and the visuals were nicely correlated with the narrative.
- 2. The Maundy Thursday service will include First Communion for four individuals, (Haile Anderson, Ariana Hopkins, Morgan Lefeber and Joseph Rose). Gwen Hoehne, Pennie Linna, and the new communicants will strip the altar.
- 3. A special Good Friday Service will include special pre-recorded music, scripture readings by various people from the congregation, and visuals.
- 4. On Easter Sunday there will be services at 8:00 am and 10:00 am. Many people have donated potted flowers to decorate the sanctuary. Jane Hartley is in charge of the decorating. People can take home their flowers after the last service. There will be communion both services.
- 5. The rest of the April services were briefly discussed.
- 6. The Church Council will be installed on April 11th. This is also "Holy Humor" Sunday.
- 7. There will be a baptism on April 18th.
- 8. Pastor Chuck will preach on April 25th. Pastor Bob will be on Vacation from April 19th-25th.

## Youth: No Meeting

- In- Person Task Force Meeting: Wednesday, April 7th, 2021
  - 1. Council decided, at their March 2021 meeting, to allow outside groups to begin meeting in the church beginning the week of April 12<sup>th</sup>. Task Force was asked to provide precautionary procedures for the groups.
  - 2. Task Force noted that groups are to follow the approved outside group use guidelines: Masks will be required.
    - \* Follow social distancing
    - \* Clean after meeting spray bottles with cleaning directions in each meeting room
    - \* No communal food Bringing of their own individual drinks and snacks will be allowed.
    - \* Room capacities: Mary room 12, Library 4, Lounge 10, Fellowship Hall 36
  - 3. NOTE: Bathrooms and common areas will be cleaned by St. Mark's.
  - 4. Bruce will pick up a few more hand spray bottles and fill with the sanitizer solution. Laurie will ensure bottles, along with a note on cleaning responsibilities, are placed in the meeting rooms.



- 5. Task Force discussed returning to singing in worship. After a discussion, it was decided to resume singing with use of hymnals beginning Sunday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Pastor Bob will include this in his worship announcements and inform people that if they feel uncomfortable with the singing in worship, that the fellowship hall is an alternative space, allowing more opportunity for greater social distancing. Masks will continue to be worn.
- 6. Reviewed how the ushering and greeting has been going. All through the pandemic there have been no issues. Task Force will continue to take on the ushering and greeting duties through April with regular teams resuming these duties beginning May 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- 7. It was also decided to have the counting teams resume their duties May 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- 8. It was noted that no one has participated in the parking lot system attendance option, since returning to in-person worship. Therefore, it was decided to discontinue this option. Laurie will post this on Facebook and ask that this be noted in the bulletin and May newsletter.
- 9. Task Force will meet in early May to review how things are going and to discuss beginning fellowship time (after worship).

#### New Business:

- 1. In light of the COVID-19 Pandemic the following decisions have been put in place for St. Mark's church. This will be revisited on an as needed basis.
  - \* St. Mark's has reopened to all outside groups. The Task Force has set up specific room size guidelines along with mask and social distancing guidelines. {See guidelines under their report}
  - \* Regular Church services for St. Marks has re-opened and is also available on Facebook Live. Now that the camera is up and able to mainstream into the Fellowship Hall we do not need to limit our church worship service attendance. Due to no parking lot attendance since the church has reopened, this will be discontinued.
  - \* Church office is presently open Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in the morning from 8:30 am to noon
  - \* Food Pantry program will continue, following safety guidelines.

All of the above decisions will continue to be monitored on a regular basis as we continue to work our way thru this health crisis facing our country.

We have completed the assessment (survey) and we are now discerning our identity.

These questions can be posted on the bulletin board in the Narthex or read and answer on the provided links on our Facebook page. Thank you to those who completed a survey. The survey is a tool to be used in discerning our identity. Survey Summary

64 total responses.

73% were women.

81% aged 55 & older.

With 1 being extremely dissatisfied & 10 being extremely satisfied, 84% rated their satisfaction between 7-10 and 16% rated their overall satisfaction with St. Mark's between 1-6.

30% think they have something (gifts, interests and time) to offer, but don't know how to do so.

83% say that the congregation, compared to three years ago, is the same or stronger.

The activities rated highest in importance at St. Mark's were Worship, Fellowship Time, Food Pantry, Missions of the Month, Sunday School, God's Work, Our Hands, and Property Caretaking/ Projects.

All written responses have been read and acknowledged by the Mission and Vision Team.


