Dear Friends in Christ,

The quote above from Martin Luther, was his response when he was asked, "What are your plans for the day?" As we see from the quote, when Luther was overwhelmed with the burdens of the day, he felt it was more important than ever to take time to pray.

I must confess that my spiritual well-being, including my time for prayer, suffers when I become busy with work and life. Maybe you are like me in that regard, or perhaps you are a prayer warrior, like Martin Luther.


Thank goodness for prayer warriors, who are committed to praying for the needs of others and who have a disciplined prayer life. I considered my mother to be a prayer warrior, although, I suppose anyone with ten children would have to be. Another great prayer warrior, theologian, and spiritual guide was St. Ignatius Loyola, a contemporary of Martin Luther.

Ignatius, who was born in 1491 in northern Spain, was seriously wounded in battle in 1521, and he experienced a conversion to Christianity while recuperating. Having recovered and now seeking to do God's will, Ignatius spent about ten months in prayer with the Benedictine monks in the caves of Manresa, Spain.

During this time, Ignatius developed what has come to be known as the Spiritual Exercises, which is essentially a manual for a spiritual retreat. Ignatius believed that just as our bodies need physical exercise, we must also exercise our spiritual self. To help in that regard, Ignatius' manual has about 15 different models for praying.

One of Ignatius' prayer techniques, called the Examen, was meant to be prayed at the end of the day. The Examen, is broken into five different points of reflection. The ones I will share with you are taken from Ignatianspirituality.com.

- 1. Ask God for light: I want to look at my day with God's eyes, not merely my own.
- 2. Give thanks: The day I have just lived is a gift from God. Be grateful for it.
- 3. Review the day: I carefully look back on the day just completed, being guided by the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Face your shortcomings. I face up to what is wrong in my life and in me.
- 5. Look toward the day to come: I ask where I need God in the day to come.

Proposal for Fellowship Serving


When a member of the church wants a special cake or dessert for an anniversary or other event:

The person who signed up would still prepare the drinks (coffee, water and juice) but would only have to serve the cake/dessert. They would also still clean-up.
- 3. Member providing the special cake or dessert should contact Connections and let them know the date.

Endowment: No Meeting.

Finance/Stewardship:

- 1. Reviewed the end of the month current account balance. May giving was \$15,790.02 and expenses were \$12,780.66. Difference was +\$3,009.36. Year to date giving towards monthly expenses is +\$7,562.73
- 2. Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$144,900.95, which includes \$64,045.39 allocated to designated accounts. Additionally, \$164,300.00 in the Thrivent money market and \$102,331.54 in the Mission Investment Fund.
- 3. Reviewed detailed financial reports. It was noted that St. Mark's received \$692 from the Thrivent Choice Dollars program and it was included in general revenue in checking account. \$2,231.38 of Technology dollars was moved out of the Thrivent money market into the Technology designated account, to cover recent technology (audio & visual) invoices.
- 4. Laurie Olson noted that the description of the "cleaning service contractor" line item under Property should read "cleaning service contractor/wages" since we are now paying our custodian on payroll and not as a contractor. Mary Jane will change this on her reports.
- 5. Pastor Bob noted that he was reviewing his St. Mark's online Elan credit card statement and rewards points. He wanted to make us aware that he redeemed the points as a statement credit. Amount was \$120. Mary Jane will follow up, when she reviews and pays the next statement.

We decided on a gospel group from Chilton call the "Voices of Peace." Possible dates to consider are October 16th or November 14th. Laurie will be contacting this group. We also plan to contact Dennis Krempien and his band to play for a service sometime this winter.

Youth: No Meeting

In- Person Task Force Meeting:

1. Reviewed the current recommendations from the CDC, regarding masks, along with other Neenah church procedures. After discussion, it was decided to make the wearing of masks optional. It was further decided to allow outside groups to have coffee and food. Outside groups should continue to clean table tops, after use. Church door signs will be updated, to reflect the change. Laurie will work with Jean to ensure outside groups are informed of the changes. We will continue to abide by the following procedures:

Do not attend in-person worship or enter the church building if are sick or have recently been sick. Maintain social distancing between family groups (6-feet).

Max of 3 per pew or a family.

No peace offering during worship, such as hand shaking or hugging.

Pre-packaged Communion elements will be used on Communion Sundays.

Laurie will post these changes on Facebook.



2. Reviewed the graduation day fellowship. Everyone thought it went well. It was decided to resume weekly after worship fellowship on June 13 with the following procedures in place:

HOSTING FELLOWSHIP DURING COVID-19

Place fellowship snacks/treats on individual serving plates/bowls.

Put a plastic eating utensil with each plate/bowl.

Place on stainless steel tables for individual pick-up.

Just before worship is concluding, pre-pour regular coffee & decaf and water & juice. These go on the brown tables against the wall. The host should pour additional cups of beverages, as needed.

Tablecloths will not be used at this time.

The Task Force agreed to meet in a few weeks to review COVID-19 status/data and make further procedural changes, as needed.

Continued to review survey results, reflect on team members insights and discuss the development of our values. Further, we looked at numerous mission statements, including our current statement. The team will present what has been developed so far to Pete, from GSB, at our next meeting via Zoom (and Zoom at St. Mark's for those wishing to attend in-person) on Thursday, June 17 at 5:30 pm.

Pillars' Emergency Shelter serves any homeless individuals regardless of their city, county, or state of origin providing they adhere to the admission criteria. All residents fall below the federal poverty guidelines for income.




We had a beautiful day for our volunteer efforts at the Filthy Fun Kid's Run in on July 17th.
