
Whether it is Easter morning or Christmas Day, our experience of these Christian celebrations is significantly enhanced by tracking the journey that we take in getting there.

Sometimes my wife Laurie and I will travel to some place where we have never been before. If Laurie happens to be driving, I will enter our destination into my smart phone and watch for the road markers on the map as they come up. As you may know, you can expand the map on your phone, or move the map around, which enables you to get a wider view of the road ahead, even to the point of seeing your final destination on the map. However, when you do this, you can lose your perspective and lose track of where you are at that moment in time.

Fortunately, when you start to explore the map, a tab appears on the screen that says, "recenter." When you push "recenter" your screen goes back so that you can once more see exactly where you are on the map. This

"recentering" feature reminds me of the church season of Advent.

As we live our lives, day to day and week to week, we can easily become distracted by the busyness of our lives and the chaos of the world around us. Many of the things that fill our days are good, healthy, life-giving things, such as school, church, and community events. We get caught up in the hustle and bustle of work schedules, doctors' appointments, and running errands. Often, we find ourselves looking ahead, planning, and frequently, worrying about the future.

A Sunday School Update



Recon Time ing a and Kids

The Bunk Bed Project® is an effort by El Amor de Patricia, an organization with the mission of *empowering Guatemalan children, families, and communities to reach their full potential.* The project provides beds for families in need. Volunteers bring the beds, which are made in Guatemala, to the homes of identified families in need and remove what they were using as beds, such as twigs, cinder blocks, wood pallets, or nothing, and replace them with new bunk beds. One bunk bed costs \$220, which includes bed/mattresses, two comforters, two pillows, and delivery with a translator and/or guide. The project uses small metal beds that will not get moldy in the rainy season and are small enough to fit in small houses. They also use thin mattresses that can be hung to dry if necessary. If you are interested in contributing to this much needed mission, please mark "Mission of the Month" on your giving envelope.

All the hats, mittens, scarves and afghans displayed on the altar rail will have a blessing and a prayer, and will be donated to various agencies to help keep our neighbors warm during these coming months. WELCA Convention Held at St. Mark's

On a beautiful Saturday morning in November, 65 women gathered here at St. Mark's for the WELCA Triennial Convention. The Local Planning Committee, Dawn Jones, Laurie Olson, and Jean Memken, had the Fellowship Hall ready to the event. With the theme, "Generations of Sisters in Christ" they decorated the tables with fall foliage and vintage pictures of women doing various church activities from times past. The morning started with a breakfast prepared by WELCA members from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Green Bay, that consisted of pastries, "Cuties" oranges, and yogurt, along with coffee, tea and juice. Then all attending went into the sanctuary where Pastor Bob led us in worship. Giving the sermon that morning was the Reverend Dr. Niveen Ibrahim Sarras. Her text was Micah 6:8 and she emphasized the problem in our country where so-called Christians do not do justice, show mercy, or walk humbly with God.

Following the worship service, we gathered in the Fellowship Hall and heard the keynote address delivered by Pastor Jenn Pockat who spoke about the ELCA efforts to bring people, especially young people, back to the church after the pandemic. She cited some very interesting studies related to characteristics of churches that successfully keep young people active in their congregations.

Following the keynote was a breakout session. One of the speakers, Paul Edison-Swift, talked about AMPARRO which is the ELCA's effort to help immigrant families. The other session was related to human trafficking and was led by Lisa McCormick.

Lunch was prepared by our own St. Mark's members. They served several different soups, white and wheat rolls, and, in keeping with the theme, an array of vintage church potluck salads, including a Jell-O mold with shredded carrots and pineapple, Watergate Salad, 7-Layer Salad, Cranberry Fluff, and Tuna Noodle Salad. That brought back a lot of great memories for those in attendance.

The afternoon program included another breakout session, which featured a presentation from Thrivent Community Engagement Leader Laura Gruender on their Action Funds program. There was also the WELCA Synod business meeting. The local arrangements committee received many compliments, and it turned out to be an enlightening, inspiring day. Saturday, December 25th - Christmas Day Worship at St Mark's, 10:00 am


* We will have a traditional Christmas worship service on Christmas morning. Join in singing the joyous carols of Christmas as we continue the celebration of Jesus' birth.
