n ancient Roman religion and Greek mythology, they recognized a mythical god named Janus. January is named after Janus. As you can see in this picture, he had two faces to see the future and the past. We are not polytheistic but monotheistic people, believing in one God. You

In all our anxiety and worries, God whispers in your ears that the plans the Lord has for you are plans to prosper you. Since God's plan is ideal, I encourage you to be prayerful about what God has planned for you. I encourage you to be willing to walk by faith in obedience as you follow God's leading. I know it is hard to follow God's plan, particularly when your plan contradicts God's. Pray that God's plan becomes yours. Reflect on where God was present with you in 2022 and imagine how God continues to accompany you in 2023. Make sure to make time to spend with Jesus. Following him daily will help you grow in faith and face your future with confidence that no matter what life brings, you are under his holy wings.

Let us pray.

God, my shelter and fortress, thank you for helping me to make it through this challenging year and for all the good and joyful times. Thank you for carrying me through the uncertainty of deep waters, the flames of trials, and the pain of hard losses. Make me constantly aware of how much I need you, your grace, strength, and power working through even the most challenging days. In Jesus's name, I pray, Amen!



November giving is \$13,551.76; Spending is \$20,571.29.



Pastor's Report:

- 1. **Homebound Visits:** I will visit Jim and Jan Traves on Thursday, December 22, 2022. Most homebound people I called either prefer a visit in January or do not pick up the phone. I leave a voicemail. I will keep trying.
- 2. **Office Work:** I am working closely with Jean and the worship team to prepare for Christmas Eve and Christmas day.
- 3. **Community Table:** I helped with the community table on Tuesday, December 13, 2022.
- 4. **Food Pantry:** I worked with the social ministry and food pantry staff, like Karen Jordan and Pat Thompson, to apply for the Appleton conference grant for our food pantry.
- 5. **Racial Equity Team.** We met on December 12, 2022, and decided to participate in the <u>Virtual Study of the ELCA's Declaration to People of African Descent: Now is the Time.</u> We will also study the book Waking Up White by Debby Irving.

Finance and Stewardship Committee - December 13, 2022 ~ Submitted by Laurie Olson

Members Present: Treasurer Mary Jane Hartley, Fern Fuhrmann, Pennie Linna, Laurie Olson, and Evie Peterson

Members Absent: Jean Memken and Pastor Niveen (were asked to not attend, since Ministry Team would be discussing compensation)

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm with a prayer.

The Treasurer reviewed the end of the month current account balance. November 2022 giving was \$13,551.76 and expenses were \$20,571.29. Difference was (\$7,019.53). It was noted that the following bills were paid in November, resulting in the larger than normal monthly deficit: insurance, final Gloria Dei invoice, synod benevolence, unexpected high-water bills (due to toilets constantly running for months & have since been repaired), back to paying a fulltime pastor, and higher electric & gas expenses. Mary Jane Hartley was asked to retrieve the WeEnergy invoices, to look at why the electric & gas were high. It was noted that the numbers noted on the reports were not the numbers on the invoice. Mary Jane will investigate this and determine if there was a data entry error or if two monthly invoices were paid in November. Year to date giving towards monthly expenses is still in the positive at +\$40,385.33.

Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$175,246.99, which includes \$54,735.72 allocated to designated accounts and the remaining \$120,511.27 available for current operating. Additionally, \$151,285.11 in the Thrivent money market, \$1,003.35 in the Thrivent T.I.P. account and \$53,182.17 in the Mission Investment Fund for the ELCA.

Reviewed detailed financial reports. The Ministry Team discussed the monthly deficit and felt that monitoring this closely is essential. The financial philosophy has been to cover the monthly expenses with

monthly giving. Having been blessed with below budget spending and above spending giving the past two years has allowed the church to accumulate a substantial pocket of funds to use for the times we fall short on individual months.

Laurie Olson distributed 2023 budget recommendations for staff and pastoral compensations. The following were approved by the Stewardship & Finance Ministry Team and recommended to the council for their approval.

Racial Equity Virtual Study Offered



"Now is the Time: the ELCA's Declaration to People of African Descent"

What does the Lord require of us? To do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God. (Micah 6:8)

One way we can do justice is to learn about the history of racism in our country. In 2019, the churchwide assembly of the ELCA adopted the Declaration to People of African Descent. A five-week virtual study of this declaration called "Now is the Time" will be offered in January and February.

they can still return their Intent Cards if they have not yet done so. Fern Fuhrmann will work on getting the amounts entered into the individual giver accounts on Church Windows.

empower individuals and families through education, safety and support, and lead our community to reduce the incidence and the effects of domestic abuse and dating violence.

The Christine Ann Shelter is the only agency providing comprehensive domestic violence programs and services to communities in Winnebago and Green Lake Counties. Launched in 1984, Christine Ann educates the community on the dynamics of abuse and how they help in the fight against domestic violence.






Team has distributed all the wonderful hand made items to help our friends and neighbors stay warm this winter. The hats, mittens and


scarves were delivered to the Christmas Giving program at the Brigade and the afghans were delivered to several nursing homes in the area. They were very happy to receive them.
