Call to order: Meeting called to order at 6:30 PM

Devotions: Sherri shared devotions. Jenny volunteered to do devotions for June.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes reviewed April 20th.

MSC to approve the minutes by Jason Blank/Sherri Denney

Approval of special meeting Minutes: Minutes reviewed from May 4th. MSC to approve the minutes by Pennie Linna/Kim Wallmuller

Thank you: Sherri, Jenny, and Pastor Niveen were thanked for the confirmation service and the work they put into the confirmation class. Financial Report: Mary Jane reviewed finances and budget standings. We are in good shape at this time. This is important before summer, due trend of less giving in summer. We are currently under budget by \$8,658.41 with spending through April at \$54,052.95. Giving toward budget was \$63,163.21, which is a net of \$9,110.26.

Pastor's Report

There is an American saying, there is no rest for the wicked. According to the Cambridge Dictionary, this

saying is "said when you must continue with your work or other activity although you are very tired." Do you know that the phrase is based on Isaiah 37: 20-21, which reads, "But the wicked are like the tossing sea, which cannot rest, whose waves cast up mire and mud. 'There is no peace,' says my God, 'for the wicked.'" Since Lent, I have been working without rest and enjoying every bit of my ministry. Here is the summary of my adventure at St. Mark's.

1. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to continue my education. I went to Milwaukee for three days to do research at Marquette University. While in Milwaukee, I visited Chuck Baumgartner at the Veteran's Hospital, where he had his surgery. I also held a virtual meeting with Addison Gipp's parents and godparents to discuss her baptism, which took place on Sunday, May 7.

2. I spent three Sundays working with Hailie Anderson and Ariana Hopkins to write their statement of faith for their affirmation of baptism service. I met with Ariana and her family and godparents to explain the meaning of baptism. The baptism and the affirmation of the baptism service occurred on Sunday, May 14, 2023. It was a very big day.

3. I officiated Dorothy Burghardt's memorial service on April 29, 2023. I met with Dorothy's family three times before and after her death to provide them pastoral care and to plan the funeral.

- 4. On Tuesday, May 2, the finance and stewardship ministry team and I watched a recorded webinar, "Church Fraud—Keeping Thieves and Embezzlers Out of Church Finances." The webinar was engaging, and we found out that Saint Mark's rules on handling our finance are compatible with what we learned from the presenters.
- 5. I met with the worship and music ministry team to plan for Sunday, May 14, service, and I also met with the connection ministry team to discuss the best way to support members of our congregation who are in need.
- 6. I met with my Neenah ELCA colleagues to plan for a joint worship at Riverside Park on September 3. This event will be an opportunity to kick off the initiative to educate the congregations on the ELCA Native American's Land Acknowledgement.
- 7. I will attend the synod assembly with Pat Westphal and Mary Jane Hartley this coming Saturday.
- 8. Finally, I will attend a conference at Nazareth College in Rochester, NY, and present my paper on Acts 10 and 11.

Ministry Team Reports


Worship and Music Ministry Team—May 8, 2023 ~ Submitted by Judy Hellman

Finance and Stewardship Ministry Team - May 16, 2023 ~ submitted by Laurie Olson

Members Present: Treasurer Mary Jane Hartley, Evie Peterson, incoming Financial Secretary Pat Westphal, and Laurie Olson

Members Absent: Pennie Linna, Pastor Niveen, Jean Memken, and outgoing Financial Secretary Fern Furhmann

Opened with a Prayer.

Reviewed current account balances through end of April 2023. April's giving was \$17,263.30 and expenses were \$15,227.63. Difference was +\$2,035.67.

Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$185,940.72 which includes \$61,932.79 allocated to designated accounts and \$124,007.93 for current operating. Additionally, \$154,650.43 in the Thrivent money market and \$1,020.28 in Thrivent TIPS account and \$53,848.32 in the ELCA Mission Investment Fund.

Laurie reviewed the purchase and installation of two new office computers (one for Office Administrator and second for the financial office). Both had been experiencing speed and storage issues. Those computers were installed on Monday, May 15, 2023. The new computers were purchased and installed by PC Mechanics of Neenah. Laurie noted that she talked with Tammie Kersten, who oversees the SCRIP program, and it was suggested to use SCRIP funds to cover this unbudgeted, but necessary expense. Finance & Stewardship Ministry Team agreed with using SCRIP funds to cover the invoice of \$1,730.99.

A presentation check (large whiteboard check) has been purchased and will be used to acknowledge special giving by St. Mark's. It was also suggested that we take a picture each month (various/different St. Mark's members holding the check each month) with the Mission of the Month agency/organization and amount noted on the check. These photos can be posted on Facebook and in the Messenger newsletter.

Mary Jane noted that St. Mark's has received a total of \$2,148 from the Thrivent Choice Dollars program. This money goes into *current offerings*.

Pat Westphal, our new Financial Secretary, commented that she has been familiarizing herself with the *Church Windows* software with training from Fern and by going on the *Church Windows* website viewing tutorials. The Finance and Stewardship Ministry Team agreed that Pat will be given access to the safe. Mary Jane will review the safe code & opening procedure with Pat.

Closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

Racial Equity Committee ~ Submitted by Pastor Barb Girod

Current work of the team includes:

Read and discussed US The Resurrection of American Terror by Rev. Kenneth W. Wheeler. Rev. Wheeler is a retired ordained pastor in the ELCA. In his book he shares his experience as an African American living in the United States and as a pastor serving in the ELCA. It is a compelling read that reveals that racism continues to do harm within our country and communities as well as within our churches.

Discussed topics and entry points that we could use to help the congregation and members reflect on racism in the life of the church and their own lives. These entry points include The library that has been established. Each member of the team will write a review of one of the books in the library. These reviews will be included in The Messenger.

Other resources, such as films available on line, will also be included in The Messenger.

The team will follow up on the Land Acknowledgement work being done by the ESCW. Land Acknowledgement includes acknowledgement that the land the church and members live on, and work on was the land of the indigenous people. It also acknowledges the culture, language, and human lives that have been lost as the land was taken by the United States.

Unfinished Business

Digital Sign Update: Ellen LaMarche has come forward to fund a new digital sign for the front of the church. The new sign will use the existing columns and power at the site, along with the inclusion of the flower bed. Laurie has met with two sign companies. Property Ministry Team, Laurie, and Ellen will look at the designs and estimates at the next Property meeting on June 5. We are very fortunate to have our donor, Ellen LaMarche, interested in helping us update the church. The sign will be electronic and we will be able to share information easily. The time frame is not known at this point. Initial impressions of the project is it will fit well with current landscaping and the current sign pillars.

Office Computers Update: The computers have been updated and scanning with the new computers from the copier is not working. Work is being done to resolve the problem. \$1,700 for computers and installation of software. Tammie Kersten has agreed to have the expenses covered with the earnings from SCRIP program.

Nursery Space Use: Current use of the nursery has been seen during funerals and occasionally on Sundays. We will clean and update. Pastor, Jenny, Gwen, Laurie, and Dawn will clean and assess use. The thought is to continue use as a nursery, but include space for meetings.

New Business Items

Synod Assembly Resolutions: Our Synod representatives have asked for guidance on how to best represent the church on the voting of three resolutions. Pat Westfall and Mary Jane Hartley will attend the Synod Assembly on Saturday, May 20th in Appleton.

- 1. Land Acknowledgement-agree to acknowledge where the land has come from. If passed, the churches will be advised to do research and develop an acknowledgment statement. Note: the racial equity mission team is currently working toward developing a statement. MSC to endorse the resolution Sherri Denney/Pastor Niveen.
- 2. Racism-Pastors of the Synod will be required to attend training and do reading. Pastor noted this is work she has already done. MSC to endorse the resolution Pennie Linna/Sherri Denney.
- 3. Hunger-Churches will be advised to be aware of hunger and strategies through education and training. St Marks is already working on this. MSC to endorse the resolution Jason Blank/Pennie Linna.

Small Group Gatherings: Small groups will gather with Pastor so she can get to know people and families. The groups will have facilitators to propose the questions. Groups will be gathering over the next few months, starting in June. Everyone in the congregation will be invited. The groups will be a mix of ages and interests.

worship anytime in June. Or designate Mission of the Month on your electronic giving account. Let's support our volunteers at the Community Table!




SpecialProjects

It is with great pleasure that we announce we have been blessed with a generous donation to fund two projects at St. Mark's. Ellen LaMarche met with Pastor Niveen and Council President Laurie Olson to discuss the funding of an outdoor digital sign (WIFI operated from the office computer with the ability to post worship times, special worship times during Lent, Christmas & Easter, events at the church such as the craft sale & VBS, clean up dates, acknowledging of holidays, etc.) and also the purchase of new paraments (cloth hangings on the altar, pulpit and baptism font in the colors of the day). Two Fox Valley companies have submitted proposals for the digital sign. These designs and estimates will be reviewed by Ellen at the Property Ministry Team meeting on June 5. Design options include the existing brick columns, power, and the flower bed. The installation date of the digital sign will be determined once a company has been chosen for the project. The Worship and Music Ministry Team is working on options and the purchasing of the paraments.

Updates on these projects will be provided via St. Mark's newsletter, Facebook page and website.

Thank you, Ellen LaMarche, for seeing the value of these projects and the impact they will have on the future of St. Mark's and thank you also for your continuing support of the work of our church. You are a blessing!



and fun celebration during our Fellowship Hour.




May 14th was also Mother's Day, and so each woman in the congregation got a flower, compliments of the Worship and Music Ministry Team.
