A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing; our helper he, amid the flood of mortal ills prevailing. For still our ancient foe does seek to work us woe; his craft and power are great, and armed with cruel hate, on earth is not his equal.

Dear Children of God gathered as St. Mark's Lutheran Church,

Grace and peace to you in Christ.

In 1527, Martin Luther faced one of the most challenging seasons of his life. The plague had struck his hometown of Wittenberg, and he and his family were living in constant danger. Many fled, but Luther stayed to care for the sick and dying. In the midst of this chaos and fear, he wrote a hymn that has endured through the ages: "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." The changing and often frightening world around him led him to find hope in the presence of God. Luther famously reminded us that while the world shifts and troubles come, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1).

As we enter autumn and witness the turning leaves, the cooler air, and the fading light, it is natural to reflect on the changes in our own lives. Some changes are welcome, while others may bring uncertainty. Yet, as Luther experienced during the plague, we are never alone, and we serve a God whose promises remain unchanging.

The Scriptures remind us of this: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). While the world around us transforms from season to season, God remains steadfast. God's love, mercy, and faithfulness endure through all generations. Just as God was with Luther in his trials, so is God with us today, no matter what changes we face.

In Psalm 100:5, we hear the promise of God's enduring love: "For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness to all generations." As we embrace this autumn season and its beauty, we are invited to rest in the knowledge that God's faithfulness to us never fades.

May we all take time this autumn to enjoy the wonder of creation and to remember that while seasons change, our God remains the same—faithful, loving, and present in every moment of our lives.



She'll return on Thursday, October 17, hopefully rested and ready to dive back into action!


Mark your calendars—she's taking another break on Sunday, October 27.

Holy Communion at St. Mark's

We will continue having Holy Communion as part of our worship service on the first and third Sundays of the month, along with some special services throughout the year. Starting in October, on the first Sunday, Communion will now be served at the Communion rail in the front of the sanctuary.

Here is how we will carry out Communion at the rail on the first Sunday of each month.

Communion Assistants will put the rails and pad in place during the Offertory Hymn and then proceed to the music room to prepare for communion distribution.

The Altar Guild volunteer of the month will take his/her place by the altar and monitor distribution in case another tray or more bread is needed.

Ushers will direct worshippers out of their pew and up to the rail. The worshippers will line up at the rail with the first person going all the way to wall and the rest following. All will kneel at the rail. If you cannot kneel comfortably, feel free to just stand at the rail for Communion.

Pastor Niveen and the **Communion Assistants** will distribute the communion elements, starting at the wall end of the rail and proceeding to the center. As soon as you finish the wine/grape juice, please rise from kneeling, deposit the empty cup in the basket next to the wall, and return to your pew for prayer/mediation and singing the communion hymns.

As **Pastor Niveen** is replacing the Communion ware on the altar, the **Communion Assistants** will remove the rails and move the pad and then return to their seats.

After all have communed, **Pastor Niveen** will speak a blessing, and the rest of the service will continue.

As always, we will continue to have self-serve communion packets for those who wish to remain in their seats during the Communion service. Pastor Niveen will direct you to use those packets before the rest of the worshippers approach the altar for Communion.

ST. MARK'S CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES September 19, 2024

Call to Order: Pennie called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm.

Devotions by Dawn Jones. October Devotions: Dawn Jones

Approval of Minutes: MSC to approve August 15 minutes Dawn Jones/Kim Wallmuller. MSC to approve special meeting on August 25 Dawn Jones/Jason Blank.

Thank yous: John Macho for joining us for Adult Forum (Dawn) and Bruce Grundman for tree trimming and hauling away the debris (Laurie).

Financial Report: Laurie reviewed current balances through end of August 2024. August's giving to current monthly expenses were \$18,787.70 in giving and expenses were \$14,840.57. The difference was \$3,947.13. Year to date (through end of August) giving was \$116,324.48 and expenses were \$111,967.24 with a difference (giving minus spending) of \$4,357.24.

Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$181,082.43 which includes \$65,755.01 allocated to designated accounts and \$115,327.42 for current operating. Additionally, \$164,510.76 in the Thrivent money market and \$1,044.10 in Thrivent TIPS account and \$55,975.38 in the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. **MSC to accept financials Kim Wallmuller/Pastor Niveen.**

Pastor's Report ~ Pastor Niveen Sarras

As we continue to witness God's grace working through us and among us, I am filled with gratitude for the ways in which we come together in service and worship, embodying the love and mission of Christ.

On September 1st, I had the privilege of joining my ELCA colleagues in Neenah for a joint worship service at Riverside Park. This gathering was a beautiful expression of unity and outreach. Together, we collected \$816, which

was generously divided between Leaven, receiving \$533, and the Lutheran Church of the Wilderness, receiving \$283. Additionally, two checks were written directly to Leaven to further support their vital work. These contributions reflect our commitment to serving our broader community and caring for those in need.

Looking ahead, I have arranged for John Macho to co-lead a session with Dawn Jones on the topic "The Church and Criminal Justice: Hearing the Cries." Mr. Macho brings extensive experience in the field of criminal justice, and I believe this will be a valuable conversation as we continue to explore our role in advocacy and restorative justice.

In youth ministry, I am working closely with Laurie Olson and Sherri Denny to invite the children and youth to participate in our Synod's Fall activities at Little Farmer on September 28, 2024. This is a wonderful opportunity for our young people to grow in faith and fellowship with others across the Synod.

This past Sunday, I also began our confirmation class with four students: Leland Tharp, Braydin Messing, Sophia Kersten, and Lily Anderson. These students will

be confirmed in May 2025. On September 29, 2024, we will gather for a retreat at Pine Lake Crossways Camp from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. This retreat will be a special time for the students to deepen their relationships with one another and with me as we embark on this spiritual journey together.

In our sacramental life, I joyfully baptized Charlotte Lynn Hulstrom on September 8, 2024, and I will soon baptize Avery Hill on September 29, 2024. It has been a blessing to meet with Avery's family and godparents, explaining the significance of baptism as we welcome her into the body of Christ.



Lastly, I remain committed to keeping our homebound parishioners connected to the life of the church. I have sent them Holy Communion and the liturgy, offering them the opportunity to nurture their faith and experience the warmth of St. Mark's community, even from afar.

Through all these moments, we see the powerful ways God is at work in our midst, and I am humbled to serve alongside each of you as we live out our faith in love, service, and witness.

Quilts Were Much Appreciated



St. Mark's Parking Lot Reconstruction Fundraiser

At the Sunday, September 22, 2024, Special Congregational Meeting, the reconstruction of the church parking lot (to take place in the spring of 2025) was approved, along with the funding sources. The total cost of the reconstruction is estimated at \$120,000. Funding: \$30,000 generous donation from Ellen LaMarche, \$30,000 from Building Fund, \$30,000 from current checking, and \$30,000 from fundraising.
