

Walking Through the Wilderness: A Lenten Reflection

Dear Beloved Children of God,

Grace and peace to you.

Time flies so quickly. Ash Wednesday is upon us—March 5, 2025—ushering in the season of Lent and its 40 days of reflection and preparation. I am grateful to be among you as your spiritual leader and to accompany you on your Lenten journey.

During Lent, we meditate on Jesus' time in the wilderness, where He fasted for 40 days and resisted the devil's temptations using the Word of God as His weapon. In this profound moment, Jesus reminds us, "One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

Each of us faces our own wilderness—a place of testing, struggle, and sometimes, deep isolation. The wilderness can take many forms: sickness, financial hardship, addiction, grief—you name it. I, too, have walked through the wilderness many times. There were moments when I thought I would not survive, moments filled with sleepless nights where I felt utterly alone. Yet, in the darkest corners of my life, God's light broke through, guiding me to green pastures and restoring my soul.

Sometimes, in our darkest and most lonely moments, when life feels like it is unraveling, we may wonder if Christ has abandoned us. In our pain, we may cry out, "WHERE ARE YOU, GOD? ARE YOU BLIND OR ON VACATION?" It is okay to ask these questions. Our God is merciful and gracious, willing to hear our cries, no matter how raw or unfiltered.

The Word of God serves as the foundation of our lives as Christians. It speaks to us about God's redeeming acts and offers hope for our future. In my own wilderness moments, I often recall how Christ has helped me in the past, trusting that He will guide me through my current trials. The words of the beloved hymn, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past", come to mind:

O God, our help in ages past, Our hope for years to come, Our shelter from the stormy blast, And our eternal home.

Jesus understands the wilderness because He has been there. He knew hunger, thirst, weakness, and temptation. Yet, He triumphed, setting an example for us. And because He triumphed, we, too, can overcome the challenges we face.

Read your Bible, spend time in prayer, and remember the words of the Apostle Paul: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:6).



This first edition is all about the Fellowship Hour Duck. If you have an item you would like to submit to "Did you know?" or you have something you would like to know about St. Mark's that we could answer in this column, please give it to Jean in the church office.

Did you know that the fellowship hour Duck container has been a part of St. Mark's for nearly twenty years, going back to when a mother duck laid eggs in the church landscaping, and we kept watch over the eggs, mother and ducklings (The laying of eggs in the landscaping has occurred many times since.) The Duck is a container that the church uses to collect donations from those attending fellowship. It is optional to contribute funds, but much appreciated. Where do the funds collected go? Fellowship hosts can choose to be reimbursed from the funds, for the supplies/ treats they purchased in hosting. The remaining funds are deposited into a designated Hospitality account and used to keep the kitchen supplied with paper products, plastic utensils, coffee, tea, cakes for special occasions, etc.—by Laurie Olson

Financial Reports: Pat Westphal reviewed current account balances through end of January 2025. January's giving

to current monthly expenses was \$13,263.02 and expenses were \$15,851.99. The difference was -\$2,588.97. (This is also year-to-date). It was noted that the additional monthly expenses were related to the following: 1. Paying the first quarterly insurance payment 2. Utilities. It was noted that the Property Ministry Team is monitoring the thermostats and will make adjustments, in an effort to conserve energy & manage utilities costs. Depending on how bills come in, from month to month and the cycle of payments, balances will adjust. \$30,000 will eventually be moved from the Building Fund into the Parking Lot Fund.

Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$228,469.93 which includes \$122,859.60 allocated to designated accounts and \$105,610.33 for current operating. Additionally, \$168,503.54 in the Thrivent money market and \$1,026.23 in Thrivent TIPS account and \$56,852.43 in the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. There is also a decline in giving due to the weather.

On Thursday, February 13, I had the privilege of meeting with our Bishop, Anne Edison-Albright, to share my annual ministry report. It was a fruitful conversation, and I look forward to continuing to work together in the mission of the church.

Lastly, I would like to propose the formation of a Mutual Ministry Team. This team, appointed by the pastor and president of the Church Council, would support the pastor and staff, fostering a positive and supportive atmosphere within our congregation. While the team would not be a decision-making body, it would be a valuable resource for advice and support.

Connections Ministry Team—No report this month

Endowment Ministry Team—No meeting this month ~ Submitted by Jean Memken

I have just begun my tenure as chair of this ministry team, so I am still learning about how the team works and where our finances stand. A few things I wanted to make you aware of:

- 1. We did receive one grant request from Linwood House to sponsor one of their summer concerts. This has been something the Endowment fund has supported in prior years. I will speak with the other team members to see if they once again approve this funding.
- 2. From the latest quarterly report for last year, it appears the account lost value in the 4th quarter after gaining value the first three quarters of the year. We ended the year with a value of \$190,770, a decrease of about \$3,000 from the end of the third quarter of 2024. Still, it is a sizable account and we do have money available to distribute should we get any other grants applications this year. Thankfully, the stock market did exceptionally well the first three quarters of 2024, so we actually gained over \$18,000 in the account since January 1, 2024.
- 3. As Church Administrator, I receive all the progress reports on this account and I keep them in a very large binder in my office. Currently, we have about 10 years or so of reports. After speaking with Dawn Jones, the past chairperson, we decided we could safely dispose of most of those reports. I will plan to keep about three years worth of reports on file here, but plan to discard the rest unless I hear otherwise from the Council.

Discussed the Food Pantry account. Laurie noted it is getting low, due to the increase of those in need being served; numbers have gone up over the past few months. It was reported that the Food Pantry received a grant from the ECSW Appleton Conference, Food Pantry is the March Mission of the Month and Jane Frantz has been seeking out grant opportunities. Laurie will attend the next Social Ministry meeting to discuss financials and see where Stewardship & Finance can be of any service.

Discussed Lent services offerings. It was noted that St Mark's has often selected an agency to receive our Lenten Worship Service offerings. After a discussion, the Stewardship & Finance Ministry team is suggesting, to the council, that the six worship service offerings be split between the general operating fund and the St. Mark's Food Pantry.

Stewardship: The team decided to again offer the "Seed Library." Laurie will apply for a Thrivent Action Team Grant to cover expenses. Also discussed was doing something similar to the seed planting, which was done with Adult Forum and Sunday School in 2024. Due to Easter being late, Earth Day does not work out for 2025. We will talk with Gwen on if this is possible this year and if so, what Sunday would work for her program and discuss further at next meeting.


About our Presenter
