Dear Children of God gathered as St. Mark's Church,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

What is leadership? Leadership is not about controlling everything or even managing an organization. It is not about making every decision alone. It is not about the importance of the leader, but about the well-being of the community the leader is called to serve. In the life of the church, leadership is about helping God's people fulfill their calling to serve Jesus Christ and live faithfully into their mission and vision.



True leadership, according to Scripture, begins with a heart that listens to God. A faithful leader seeks the Lord, walks humbly, and encourages others to grow in faith. Jesus said, "whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant" (Mark 10:43, NRSV). Christian leadership is servant leadership.

The great theologian Henri Nouwen wrote, "The leaders of the future will be those who dare to claim their irrelevance in the contemporary world as a divine vocation that allows them to enter into a deep solidarity with the anguish underlying all the glitter of success, and to bring the light of Jesus there." Nouwen reminds us that leadership is not about status or power, but about compassion, humility, and presence.

Consider Moses. God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt (Exodus 3:10). Yet Moses knew his limitations and depended on God's strength (Exodus 4:10-12). He did not place himself above the people. Instead, he journeyed with them through hardship and hope. Scripture says, "Now the man Moses was very humble, more so than anyone else on the face of the earth" (Numbers 12:3, NRSV).



Think also of Deborah, prophetess and judge of Israel. She led with wisdom and courage in a dangerous time, working alongside Barak for the deliverance of God's people (Judges 4:4-9). Her leadership was rooted in trust in God and service to the nation.

Above all, we look to Jesus Christ. Our Lord led through love, humility, and sacrifice. He declared that he came “not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many” (Mark 10:45, NRSV). He challenged hypocrisy and injustice, yet welcomed the vulnerable, the outsider, and the sinner with grace and mercy.

That is true leadership: humility, courage, compassion, and faithfulness. It is walking with people, not standing above them. It is seeking God’s will, not personal glory.

In June, during our Synod Assembly, we will elect a bishop. Bishop Anne Edison-Albright has nominated herself for a second term, and another candidate, Pastor Josh Fite, from St. John’s Lutheran Church in Green Bay, will also stand for election. I ask you to pray that the assembly may discern and elect the one whom God is calling for this time and season. Pray for a leader who is humble, prayerful, compassionate, and willing to serve rather than be served.

And please pray for me, your pastor, that I may continue to grow as a servant leader—always learning, always listening, and always working together with you for the sake of the Gospel and the kingdom of God.

May the Holy Spirit guide Christ’s Church and raise up leaders after God’s own heart.

I want to wish you all a fun summer and be safe!!! God is always with you!

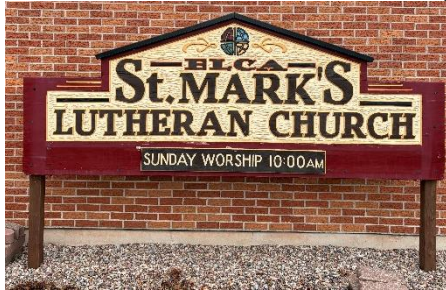

Landscaping at St. Mark's – by Phyllis Ziemke and Deb Martola



The plants and flowers that add beauty to the St Marks' property have been a long-time passion of many in the congregation. Several years ago, from 1960 to 2000, before the renovation of the front entrance, and subsequently the addition of the fellowship hall, there was a simple church sign in a brick raised planter with shrubs in it. Shrubs were also planted, along the north and west sides of the building, which subsequently Don Peterson, Joe Van Vaghel and some youth kindly removed from the north side, preparing the property for updates. Somewhere between 2001 and 2002 when the new entrance and new addition was built, the church bell was donated by Linda Degner and her husband and placed in its current location. There has been necessary maintenance and upkeep done on the bell through the years.



When the church entrance was changed, so was the placement of the (second) church sign...which was more visible to traffic on Green Bay Road from both north and south. This sign was made and maintained by Old Oak Shop, Inc. located in New Holstein Wisconsin, and with the help of Joe and Sandy Deckers, it was repaired and refinished in 2015, and again in 2019. It now stands proudly on the north side of the Fellowship Hall.

The bed under that sign was laid with stone from K.C., and Paul and Jacob Thompson planted flowers in it, along with help from the Deckers. Over the years, there have been ornamental grasses planted, along with seasonal plants and flowers purchased from Oakwood Gardens. Thanks to Tom Wenzel and Bruce Grundman for turning the soil, so every year new flowers could be added. The beds along the north side of the building have had some updates as well, with stones added in between plants of Hosta and Coral Bells.

The center courtyard area circumvented by the east sanctuary wall and west classroom hallway, primarily maintained by Ginny Schieck, with help from Mary Jane Hartley and Pastor Niveen, is also an updated lovely and peaceful sanctuary for those that want to find tranquility and rest.

Annuals such as Geraniums and Diamond Frost are added around the bell and under the current sign, funded by donations from our congregation for Pentecost Sunday.



About three years ago, the progression of flowering beds began along the east side of the lot next to the fence line, with Bruce Grundman cultivating the soil and adding beautiful Peony plants from his mother Audrey's garden. Other donated colorful flowering plants and bushes were added by Pat Thompson, Joy Case, and Phyllis Ziemke. In the late spring of last year, a memorial tree was planted by the family of Walt Ziemke in the grassy area north of the parking lot.

In 2023, a donation by Ellen LaMarche enabled the church to install a modern electronic sign, which greets all passing by. Pat Westphal creates the content seen on the sign each week. Several members of the property committee have made it their commitment with a work in progress to improve the "curbside appeal" of the new sign area, as well as continuing to add the exquisite works of Gods' hands to the property for all to enjoy!

Financial Report: Laurie reviewed current account balances through end of March 2026. March's giving to current monthly expenses was \$16,139.25 and expenses of \$16,446.98. The difference was -\$307.73

Total Associated Bank checking has a balance of \$166,030.71 which includes \$70,659.83 allocated to designated accounts and \$95,370.88 for current operating. Additionally, \$176,070.99 in the Thrivent money market/short term bonds and \$1,068.40 in Thrivent TIPS account and \$59,103.16 in the ELCA Mission Investment. Year-to-date: \$41,270.63 in expenses and \$43,461.65 in giving with a net of \$2,191.02.

On March 21, I participated in the synod candidacy committee meeting, where we met two new candidates. One has been approved to begin the call process, and the other to begin seminary. We give thanks for the Holy Spirit’s continued calling of leaders into ministry, raising up servants for the Church’s future.

On March 23, I attended the Worship and Music Ministry Team meeting to prepare for Holy Week. The Spirit guided our planning, helping us shape meaningful and prayerful liturgies that led us deeply into the mystery of Christ’s passion and resurrection.

Throughout this season, I have continued teaching Sunday School and co-leading Bible Study with Dawn Jones. Even when schedules shifted due to Palm Sunday and Easter, the Spirit sustained our community’s desire to grow in faith and understanding.

A special highlight was our hosting of Dr. Kartika Putri on April 12. Through her music, message, and cultural sharing, the Holy Spirit expanded our vision of the global Church. Singing in Indonesian and sharing fellowship through Indonesian food reminded us that the Body of Christ transcends all boundaries and is united in one Spirit.

Our outreach ministries continue to reflect the Spirit’s work. The Social Ministry Team meeting and Community Table gathering embody Christ’s compassion and care for our neighbors. I also continue teaching Lay School monthly, equipping members for deeper discipleship, with my final session approaching in May.

We look ahead with joy to May 3, when we will celebrate baptisms for Vayda, Josie, and Layla, and First Communion for Tyler, Avery, Vayda, and Hunter. These sacred milestones are signs of the Holy Spirit’s ongoing work—bringing new life into Christ and nurturing faith in our young people.

Our Holy Week and Easter celebrations were deeply meaningful. Although attendance on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday was lower due to the weather, the presence of the Holy Spirit was evident in our intimate gatherings and shared worship with the ELCA Neenah churches. On Easter Sunday, we rejoiced together with 96 worshipers, celebrating the resurrection and the new life it brings.

In all these moments—in calling, teaching, worship, fellowship, and service—we see the Holy Spirit actively shaping our church into a vibrant, faithful, and loving community.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Hallelujah!

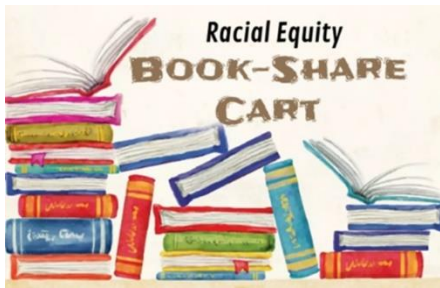

I really appreciated reading *Selma's Bloody Sunday* by Robert A. Pratt. It's a short book, but it left a strong impression on me. The way Pratt tells the story of the march across the Edmund Pettus Bridge made the events feel real, not just something from a history textbook.

What stood out most to me was the courage of the people who marched, especially leaders like John Lewis. Reading about what they faced helped me better understand the sacrifices behind the right to vote—something that can be easy to take for granted. I also liked how the book connects that day to the bigger picture of the civil rights movement. It made me reflect on how much progress has been made, and how important it is to continue paying attention to issues of justice and equality today.

I would definitely recommend this book to anyone looking for a meaningful, thought-provoking read. It's brief, but it stays with you. The book can be checked out from the St. Mark's Racial Equity Book Cart. – *Laurie Olson*

Bible Study Continues on Sundays at 9:00 am

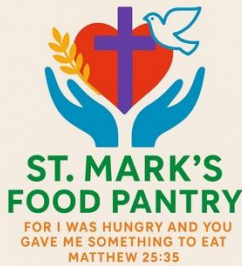
Dawn Jones and Rev. Niveen will continue taking turns leading Bible Study. Rev. Niveen will continue teaching on the **Book of Ruth**.

Midweek Bible Study continues on Thursdays at 1:30 pm

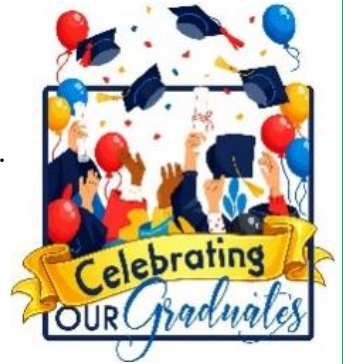
